COVID 19 UPDATE

As 2020 comes to a close, the most pressing factor we have dealt with, and continue to deal with at CLAPW is the COVID 19 pandemic. The disruption caused by the virus and many restrictions implemented to keep people safe and well, have been extraordinarily challenging for so many. We recognize the additional strain placed on families, the people we support and our hardworking staff members. It has been a time of great uncertainty and constantly changing information. It is heartbreaking to see the devastating impacts the virus is having within long term care settings and we are thankful that our smaller residential settings provide some protection to the people we support. We realize that many are missing preferred activities including family visits, community outings, day programs and seeing friends.

We extend our **heartfelt thanks** to our dedicated staff members who have continued working throughout the pandemic. They work in difficult conditions wearing face shields and surgical masks for the duration of their shifts. They have increased their cleaning and are responsible to carefully monitor the people they support for COVID symptoms. Many have been re-assigned to new locations. They had to learn technology that was foreign to them. They have shifted from working tirelessly to help people to access the community, to having to restrict people's community access to keep them safe. **This has been difficult** on so many levels.

We worry about our families who have not had access to regular day supports in months. We worry about families who are missing their loved ones who live in one of our residential settings. And of course, we worry about the people we support, who have endured months of restricted activities and may not fully understand the reason for all the changes.

We will continue to be careful and vigilant and take every possible precaution to keep people safe. We **continue to remain hopeful**, even as the case numbers continue to rise, that with better knowledge of the virus and the promise of a vaccination, we will soon be able to put these dark days behind us.





FAMILY SUPPORT GROUP

Throughout 2020 we hosted regular meetings of a family support group called **Families as Partners** thanks in part to partnership funding through a Town of Ajax Impact Grant. Participants heard about trends in the Developmental Services Sector and heard from a variety of speakers. Because of the pandemic we quickly had to move our programming on-line. We welcomed guest speakers and took advantage of other events and webinars previously scheduled by partners. We plan to continue this work and look forward to the day when families can gather in person. In the meantime, we have purchased family facilitation workbooks that we will be sharing with our families soon.

These workbooks created by the Family Voice of Lanark County offer a useful roadmap/process for families to follow when thinking about and planning for a desirable future for their loved one. Arrangements for the distribution of the guides will be made in the new year.

THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS






Natalie has been helping out in the card making group with individuals involved in CEP. They have been making cards for seniors and soldiers for Christmas.
